Spring 2 Newsletter - Year 6

Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back! We are excited to share with you the exciting learning that is going to be taking place this term.

In maths, we will be learning about basic algebra, as well as looking at different types of graph, and learning about the 'mean' in statistics. Children will also recap their shape knowledge (including angles) and learn about 3D shapes and their nets. Additionally, we will be recapping area and perimeter, and we will introduce volume. Finally, we will be doing lots of revision of number (including fractions) and four operations to continue to improve our fluency!

In literacy, we have started the term by developing a balanced argument in response to the 'news' that the school day will be changing to run from 7am to 5pm. Interestingly, the children seem to have fallen sharply on one side of this argument...!

In reading, we will continue to explore a range of texts and activities, recapping and building on their knowledge and understanding of the key reading skills. We are continuing to read 'Impossible Creatures' by Katherine Rundell as our class book, which we are loving so far!

In science this term we are learning about evolution. We started by learning about inherited characteristics, using Peggy as our case study! We look at which characteristics she had inherited from each of her parents. We will go on to look at adaptation, and then we will study the evidence for evolution – fossils!

The children will be getting stuck into some fantastic learning experiences with the wider curriculum this term. In history, we will continue to focus on Britain since 1945, specifically looking at the role of women.

In geography, the children will be continuing to explore the physical and human features of North America. This term, we will specifically be looking at natural disasters, with a case study of the East Coast of the USA. We are going to be looking at hurricanes, earthquakes, volcanoes and more!



In PE, we have several sessions with Ursula our gymnastics coach to complete our indoor PE topic! Outdoor PE will be looking at netball and handball, with a focus on strategies to keep possession and shooting.
